Brief Overview

The Aisle Project has been an ambition of the church and Friends Group for over 15 years, but it suffered numerous setbacks and challenges. Following the success of *Feltwell's Faith in Flint* (see separate project summary) there was renewed enthusiasm to revive plans. The Aisle Project had the following priorities:

- install an accessible toilet and a kitchen; connect the church to mains water and sewerage
- replace part of the floor in the north aisle (pews had already been removed) to make it level
- fill an old boiler pit which was a hazard.

Covid and the lockdowns gave people time to submit numerous grant applications. It also led to new uses of the church, such as the establishment of a Food Pantry. This helped to build a stronger case for support.

In April 2024, the aisle was formally opened by Lady Dannatt and the church is now host to a thriving weekly community café.

Top Tips:

- When planning any changes to your church, get an early steer from the DAC.
- Never spend or commit money you haven't seen in your bank account first!
- One thing which really helped with grant applications was <u>this video</u> demonstrating the need.
