### **Reflection**

The Refection for January in our Prayer Diary says -

*"As we begin this new year, we are full of wonder and gratitude! Mary Sumner had a vision of women supporting each other in their faith and families. The ripples have gone out over the years – to over 4 million members in 84 countries, changing families and communities. One woman in one parish began it all.*

*One small boy had a picnic – but in the hands of Jesus, it fed a multitude, with 12 baskets of leftovers – nothing was wasted!*

*In His hands every small offering of service and prayer from each of us is used and multiplied, and nothing is wasted."*

If Mary Sumner had been able to look forward, I'm sure she would not have envisaged how her idea has spread around the world. How well the words from Jeremiah apply to her, and we are among her long line of descendants.

January is named after Janus the 2 headed Roman God, looking both backward and forward, to the past and to the future. So, as we look forward to celebrating 150 Years, we also look back on what has been achieved by members during the last 150 years, around the world, and especially here in Ely Diocese. In recent years we may not have been as “hands –on” as members in other countries, who lead Literacy or Health or Agricultural Self Sufficiency programmes; for instance. . One notable exception is our valiant team who lead the Relationship Courses at Little Hey Prison.

Most of our support is through collecting or making goods for those who live locally and have met with adversity; whether they are care leavers in a hostel, abused and seeking refuge, homeless/living on the streets, or in need of knitted comforts. The data for 2025 shows that there have been a minimum of 1, 610 items donated - it’s not absolutely accurate as some recordings are for “a bag of toiletries”, and the data doesn’t include items branches give directly, but you can see the difference we make.

Fundraising for projects, the vouchers at Christmas, and Afia Holidays are also ways that we support. We are all playing our part in reaching out as Christ’s hands across the world.

Now as we look forward, we wonder just how can we continue this vital support that is increasingly so needed? There is no easy way to put this – **We Must Increase Our Membership** - here in Ely Diocese, in Canterbury Province and in the Britain and All Ireland zone.

Maybe membership will not be as we understand it – times change. Most of us are, or were, branch members, but so often possible members have said to me “I can’t be a member, I work” or “I childmind that day” etc. We must emphasise that one can be a member without attending meetings. Our annual subs are what keeps the organisation running, supporting members and the projects around the world. Of course, membership does entitle you to attend meetings/ gatherings/ conferences etc. anywhere, if you wish. We can and must increase membership to keep our vital work going. We cannot be responsible for letting our wonderful organisation die, or just slip quietly away.

No one is saying that it will be easy, however with prayer, determination and effort – quite possibly feeling “out of our comfort zone” - we will survive!

So, now we look forward to 2026 and our celebrations. 5 Cluster gatherings around the diocese; a cathedral service on August 7<sup>th</sup>, the Picture and Prose Anthology and the 150 Challenge to branches and individuals – have you planned yours yet? And hopefully a Bishops Garden Party to enjoy and hopefully meet the new Bishop, we wait for a date to be confirmed. Nearby here, in the Almonry Garden, we are hoping to install a bird bath with a commemorative plaque. Opportunities to enjoy fellowship together, inspire one another; and for others to “Join Us and Join In” during our 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary year.

Let us pray together -

**Almighty God, we give thanks for the 150 years of Mothers' Union, for the faithful ministry of Mary Sumner and all members, and for the many blessings that You have given to families and communities around the world.**
