## New Testament Reading: Ephesians 3:14-22

For this reason I fall on my knees before the Father, <sup>15</sup>from whom every family in heaven and on earth receives its true name. <sup>16</sup>I ask God from the wealth of his glory to give you power through his Spirit to be strong in your inner selves, <sup>17</sup>and I pray that Christ will make his home in your hearts through faith. I pray that you may have your roots and foundation in love, <sup>18</sup>so that you, together with all God's people, may have the power to understand how broad and long, how high and deep, is Christ's love.<sup>19</sup> Yes, may you come to know his love—although it can never be fully known—and so be completely filled with the very nature of God.

## Gospel Reading: Mark 12:28-31

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ.  
**Glory to you, O Lord.**

One of the teachers of the law came and heard them debating. Noticing that Jesus had given them a good answer, he asked him, 'Of all the commandments, which is the most important?'

<sup>29</sup>'The most important one,' answered Jesus, 'is this: "Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one. <sup>30</sup>Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your

soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.”<sup>31</sup> The second is this: “Love your neighbour as yourself.” There is no commandment greater than these.’

### **Notes for Wave of Prayer Service**

### Talk/sharing of stories

If wished, the talk may lead to, or take the form of the sharing stories of communications with your link dioceses; answers to prayer and responses to specific circumstances. If stories are limited you may like to share more generally about the circumstances of the area.

If you wish to include a Statement of Faith it may be added after this section.

### Thanksgiving and intercessions

Include specific prayers for your own link dioceses here.  
There may also be a symbolic offering of items representing link dioceses.  
If numbers allow, you may like to consider a creative prayer activity whereby people write on paper chains their name and promise to uphold the links in prayer. These may be linked together during the intercessions and laid at the altar.

The Lord's Prayer and Mothers' Union Prayer may be added after the intercessions.

### Symbolic lighting of candles

At the beginning, or during the prayers of thanksgiving and intercession, small candles representing link dioceses could be lit from a larger candle - the light of Christ - as a symbol of our prayers on their behalf. This could happen as the names of dioceses are being read. The smaller candles may be arranged in circles to highlight the mutuality of relationship and prayer support. Remember to include a candle to represent your own diocese.

If you have a large map of the world this could be displayed at the front and the candles placed on the relevant areas of the map.

Flags from the countries your dioceses are in could also be displayed, or included on the service booklet.
